The Great Start Readiness Program (GSRP) is a FREE preschool program for families that meet program requirements; including eligibility guidelines and/or existing risk factors. Please note, families with income above the GSRP guidelines may qualify for our program and will be charged tuition, based on our county adopted sliding scale. **Children must be 4 years old on or before September 1, 2017 and should be toilet trained.**
